Saved by works?

Men today have to realize they are guilty and helpless before God. One day they will have to meet Him in all the splendor of His holiness and in all the harshness of His judgment. All we can do in such a situation is to tremble and ask ourselves: Who can possibly save me? This question is very serious because one day very soon each one of us will have to give an account of his life to God.

The deep desire of a soul who wants to be at peace with God will never find lasting satisfaction in any kind of religion, philosophy or sect.
